

#### **Registration Status Overall**


•Overall, 68% of all children were registered in kindergarten before the June 30<sup>th</sup> campaign goal. Of the 6,645 children enrolled in kindergarten across all six school districts with SUN programming 35% were missing registration data.



## Kindergarten Registration by School District

 Across all six school districts more than half of the children enrolled this year in kindergarten were enrolled by the June 30<sup>th</sup> campaign goal. Gresham Barlow, PPS, and Parkrose enrolled more than 70% of their kindergarteners early.

# Kindergarten Registration by Race/Ethnicity


- Of the 2,075 children of color registered in kindergarten this school year, 65% were registered by June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Registration Data by race/ethnicity:
  - Asian 77.0%,
  - White 70.0%,
  - Hispanic 69.5%,
  - Native American 54.3%,
  - Black 50.8%
  - Pacific Islander 42.6%

## Analysis of Register by June Campaign Data and Kindergarten Attendance

- Overall, children who were registered early in kindergarten were significantly more likely to have 90% or better attendance in kindergarten (p = .000).
- By race/ethnicity group Black (p = .02),
  Hispanic (p = .000), and White (p = .000)
  children who were registered early were also
  significantly more likely to have 90% or better
  attendance in kindergarten


#### Pre-Kindergarten Experience Data

There were 4,285 children with pre-kindergarten experience data reported in synergy. Of those, 71.8% reported pre-k experience, 3.7% of children's parents chose to not respond to this question and 24.5% did not have pre-k experience.



## Pre-Kindergarten Experience Data by School District

 Analysis of pre-K experience data by school district suggests that PPS was the only school district most likely to have children with pre-k experience.




# Analysis of Pre-K Experience Data and Kindergarten Attendance

 Children at Centennial (p=.008), Gresham Barlow (p=.000), and PPS (p=.000) with pre-k experience were significantly more likely to have an attendance rate of 90% or better in kindergarten than those children without prek experience.

### Pre-K Experience by Race/Ethnicity

 Black, Native American and White children were significantly more likely to have pre-k experience (p = .000).
